<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we will learn how to:

- Represent numbers to 10,000.
- Partition numbers to 10,000.
- Find 1/10/100/1,000 more less within 10,000.
 - Compare numbers to 10,000.
 - Order numbers within 10,000.
 - Use Roman numerals.
- Round to the nearest 10/100/1,000.

This term's times table focus is the 9 times table.

<u>PSHE</u>


This term's PSHE lessons will focus on internet safety. We will learn about:

- What the internet is used for.
- The benefits of the internet.
- The importance of limiting internet usage.
- Age restrictions of games and websites.
 - How to report issues online.
- How to treat others with respect when using the internet.

<u>English</u>

This term, we will create poems about things that are special and important to us. We will focus on the following:

- Reading and performing a range of poems.
 - Using the senses to describe.
 - Using metaphors, similes and personification.
 - Using capital letters for effect.
- Understanding what nouns, verbs and adjectives are.
- Using adverbs to add additional detail.



<u>Art</u>

We will be studying the work of Vincent Van Gogh. We will use sketching and painting to create our own Vincent Van Gogh inspired landscapes.

<u>History</u>

We will answer the following questions during our history lessons:

- Who were the Romans and why did Julius Caesar want to invade Britain?
- Who were the Britons and why did Claudius invade Britain in 43CE?
- Why was the Roman army so successful in spreading the Roman Empire?
 - Who was Boudicca and how did she challenge Roman rule in Britain?
- How did the Romans try to defend the land they took while taking more?
- What caused the decline of Roman Britain and the end of Roman rule?

<u>RE</u>

We will answer these questions during RE this term:

- How do Hindus show their faith?
- What is important for Hindus?
- Why is Mahatma Gandhi a Hindu Hero?
- What is it like to be a Hindu in Britain today?

What can we do at home?

Actively encourage your child to read. Encourage the use of TTRS. Look through this half term's knowledge organisers. Do one homework task each week and upload to Dojo (homework tasks sent home during the first week of each term). Practise spellings each week. Weekly Century tech homework tasks.

Writing task

Go outside (this could be in your garden, outside your house, a local park, or just a nice walk somewhere) and create a simple poem about what you saw. Your poem could describe what you saw, felt, smelt or heard.

Maths task

Create 5 word problems involving the 9 times table.

Example: Mr Ellison has 9 boxes. Each box contains 4 toys. How many toys are there in total?

History task

Use the internet or books to find out 5 interest facts about the Roman Empire. You could create a video to share your facts, make a poster, or write sentences to show what you have learned.

Art task

Sketch a picture of a local landscape. If you're able to, you could add colour to it too. You could try to create a drawing in the style of Vincent Van Gogh!

PSHE task Create a poster, leaflet or fact file to show younger children how to stay safe online.

In addition to the above tasks, Year 4 children should also:


- Regularly use TTRS to develop times tables fluency.


