

#### Vision

At Holden Clough, we believe that music is a vital part of a well-rounded education, fostering creativity, enhancing cognitive development and building a sense of community among our students and staff. Our vision is to cultivate a dynamic and inclusive musical environment where every child can discover their unique musical voice and develop a lifelong appreciation for music. Music education at our school is more than learning to play instruments and sing songs. It is about inspiring confidence, encouraging self-expression and developing essential skills that extend beyond the classroom. Through music, our students learn discipline, collaboration and emotional intelligence. We are committed to providing a rich and varied music curriculum that reflects the diverse interests and abilities of our students.

#### <u>Aims</u>

Our music curriculum is structured around four key areas: singing, listening, performing and composing. Our aims for each area are as follows:

- Singing: Weekly singing assemblies for both Reception-KS1 and KS2 taught by the music subject lead and covering the Holden Clough Singing Repertoire (page 8) allow pupils to learn vocal warm-ups and how to look after their vocal health, as well as to practise their breathing, posture, dynamics and phrasing. All teachers are given the opportunity to attend these sessions as a form of CPD, allowing all teachers, over time, to feel more confident in delivering singing sessions.
- 2. **Listening:** The Holden Clough Listening Repertoire (page 5) is a carefully selected list of music that includes Western Classical Music and variety of popular music and traditional music from around the world that reflects the community our school is in. Teachers explore these pieces with their classes during weekly music lessons whilst discussing the inter-related dimensions of music and engaging with listening activities.
- 3. **Performing:** Holden Clough work closely with Tameside Music Service who provide wholeclass instrumental teaching programmes. Our students learn keyboard-based instruments (glockenspiels in KS1 and keyboards in KS2) throughout their time at our school, therefore allowing them to become proficient in both the piano and staff notation in the treble and bass clefs before KS3.
- 4. **Composing:** Composition is taught during the whole-class instrumental teaching programmes delivered by Tameside Music Service. The wide variety of pieces the children are exposed to in both the singing and listening repertoires support the pupils in developing the craft of creating melodies and fashioning these into short pieces.

#### Enrichment

We also offer all pupils at Holden Clough a variety of enrichment opportunities, including clubs, trips and whole-school music days.

**Clubs**: choir, string orchestra and performing arts club.

Listening	Teachers spend some time every week listening to their 'piece of the month' and discussing the inter-related dimensions of music.	Teachers use Charanga, however the KS2 teachers find this very difficult to use, sometimes leading to music not being taught.	-Music coordinator has written a listening repertoire which shows progression from nursery-Y6.  -Music coordinator will lead 3 staff CPD sessions across the year (autumn, spring and summer) where the inter-related dimensions of music are explained, reflecting what the teachers will be expected to discuss during listening sessions with students.  -Teachers will display their 'piece of the month' outside their classroom.  -Teachers will teach short, focused listening sessions using the repertoire and questions written by the music coordinator.
Performing	Instruments are taught across a number of years to allow students to progress in that particular instrument (glockenspiels in KS1 and keyboards in KS2).	Instruments change almost every year, meaning students are not given time to progress in one instrument or learn staff notation for that instrument to a high standard.	-Headphones and keyboards will be ordered so there are enough for 1 between 2 in every classMusic coordinator will collaborate with Tameside Music Service to create a performance curriculum that shows clear progression from reception-Y6.
Composing	High-quality composition lessons are taught within whole-class instrumental lessons.	Composition is taught in whole-class instrumental lessons but the children find this very difficult.	-Music coordinator and SLT will focus on improving the singing, listening and performing aspects of the music curriculum first. This will then, eventually, lead to the pupils finding composition lessons easier due to them having a secure foundational knowledge of music.
Enrichment	All children are able to get involved with extra-curricular music activities, clubs and trips.	There are plenty of enrichment opportunities for KS2 students, but less for children in nursery-Y2.	-Music coordinator will discuss with SLT the opportunities for more KS1 musical clubs and collaborate with Tameside Music Service to discuss options for after-school sessionsOpportunities such as Young Voices and PopUK will be booked throughout the year.
