PE days: Friday. Please send you child into school in full PE kit on this day.

Forest school: Thursday PM. Please send you child to school with suitable weatherproof clothing and footwear in a bag.

Book change day: Wednesday but please ensure your child's book is in school every day.

Maths:

This half term we will focus on:

- Numbers as parts and wholes (example: 7 is the whole. 3 + 4 are the parts that make 7).
- Writing number sentences (example: 3 + 2 = 5).
- Number bonds within 10.
- Adding numbers.
- Solving simple addition word problems (example: Mrs Howarth had three sweets. Then, she bought four more. How many does she have in total?).
- Subtraction: using drawings to take away (drawing pictures and crossing out).
- Counting backwards.
- Finding 1/2 more or less than a number.

We will also learn about shape:

- Naming 2D shapes.
- Naming 3D shapes.
- Sorting 2D and 3D shapes (example: sorting shapes with 3 sides; finding shapes that will roll or stack).
- Making patterns with 2D shapes.

Science

This half term we will continue to learn about 'Seasons'. We will investigate the changing seasons with a specific focus on Winter. Our learning will include:

- Seasonal changes.
- Changes to the environment.
- Winter weather
- Clothing for winter
- What happens to animals in winter.

English

This half term, we will be developing our independent writing skills by becoming authors of our own Fairy tale books! We will be using a range of familiar Fairy tales to help sequence our own sentences.

We will also be:

- Applying taught phonics when writing.
- Forming letters correctly.
- Leaving spaces between words.
- Using capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- Orally rehearsing sentences and reading sentences out loud.
- Using adjectives to add detail.
- Using 'and' to join clauses.



What can you do at home?

Read lots of stories with your child.

Do one homework task each week and upload to dojo.

Listen to your child read as much as possible. Remember to sign the reading diaries to earn a raffle ticket!

RE

In RE we will be continuing to explore the question: How and why do we celebrate special times?

We will think about the different ways we celebrate with our families.

We will look at Celebrations in the Christian, Hindu, Muslim and Jewish faiths.

History

Our history enquiry question is:

How are toys today similar and different from toys in the past?

The children will:

- Sort toys according to their uses.
- Describe a favourite toy.
- Hear from a range of people about toys they played with in the past.
- Explore a range of toys from the past.
- Put toys in chronological order.



PSHE

Through our PSHE learning we will:

- recognise and talk about emotions, including having a varied vocabulary of words to use when talking about their own and others' feelings
- Recognise and communicate feelings to others
- Learn how to share views respectfully
- Recognise, name and deal with feelings in a positive way.
- Learn to take part in discussions with one other person and the whole class.

<u>DT</u>

In DT we will be making sandwiches. We will be thinking about healthy choices through an exploration of different breads and fillings. We will be evaluating a range of products and discussing our preferences as well as making and tasting our own sandwiches. All dietary requirements will be catered for.



Maths:

Go on a shape hunt! Explore your house or go outside and make a list (or take photos!) of all of the different shapes that you find.

English:

Write a description of your favourite toy.

Can you draw a picture <u>and</u> write a sentence to tell us what it is made of, how it moves or why it is so special?

History

Interview somebody who is much older than you.

Ask them:

- What kind of toys did you play with?
- What were your favourite childhood TV shows?
- What is different about life now compared to when you were a child?
 - You could create a video to show your interview or write the answers.


