For now, let's dive into what the children will be learning this half-term.




Topic

This half term, our topic is Conflict and Resolution. This unit aims to deepen pupils' understanding of British history by extending their chronological knowledge beyond 1066. It provides an overview of the First and Second World Wars and examines how conflict continues to affect the world today.

The unit begins by exploring the origins of the First World War, focusing on the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand as a key trigger. Pupils will also learn about the role of the British Empire, highlighting that the war was not fought by Britain alone. They will study the individuals who participated in the conflict, gaining insight into how Britain relied on support from its colonies and the introduction of laws like conscription to strengthen its army.





Mathematics

We will begin our learning journey with the topic of Fraction, Decimals and Percentages (FDP), covering the following key concepts:

Step 1 Decimal and fraction equivalents
Step 2 Fractions as division
Step 3 Understand percentages
Step 4 Fractions to percentages
Step 5 Equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages
Step 6 Order fractions, decimals and percentages
Step 7 Percentage of an amount - one step
Step 8 Percentage of an amount - multi-step
Step 9 Percentages – missing values

Once we have completed our work FDP, we will be moving towards Ratio.


Writing

This half-term, we will begin our Writing Root based on Resist by Tom Palmer. The novel, inspired by the true childhood story of Hollywood star Audrey Hepburn, explores her involvement in World War II in the Nazi-occupied Netherlands.

As part of this unit, children will make predictions and build their vocabulary around the theme of resistance, participating in a debate about the pros and cons of joining the resistance movement. As they delve into the book, they will unpack complex themes and emotions while producing a range of written outcomes. These will include recruitment posters, diary entries written in role, journalistic articles for the de Oranjekrant resistance newsletter, persuasive leaflets, and a character description.

Reading

During Guided Reading, we will be exploring Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah. Below is a brief synopsis of the book:



In 1958, Leonard travels with his mother from Jamaica to England to join his father. The novel follows Leonard as he struggles to adapt to life in Britain. Although Windrush Child is a fictional story, Benjamin Zephaniah was inspired by historical events when he wrote Windrush Child.

PSHE

This half-term, we will continue exploring PSHE with a particular focus on the topic of Health. Our learning will cover the following key objectives:

Recognise early signs of physical illness, such as weight loss or unexplained changes in the body.

Develop self-assessment skills to understand how these can inform future actions. Take responsibility for their own safety and that of others, including knowing how to seek help in an emergency.

Understand the facts and science behind immunisation and vaccination.

Listen to and show consideration for the views of others.
